The issue in a criminal trial is always whether the accused is guilty of the offence he is charged with, and never whether he is innocent. There is consequently a well defined distinction between the duties which a prosecutor and a counsel for the accused respectively discharge. The duty to prove the affirmative rests with the prosecution and the function of the prosecutor is not to secure a conviction but to see that justice is done. He is not merely an advocate for a party but a part of the court-a kind of minister of justice, filing a quasi-judicial position. The duty of the advocate for the accused however is to protect his client as far as possible from being convicted by a competent tribunal, except upon legal evidence, sufficient to support a conviction for the offence with which he is charged.
