The Bar and Bench both play important role in the administration of justice. Actually both are complimentary to each other. The primary duty of the lawyer is to inform the court as to the law and facts of the case and to aid the court to do justice by arriving at correct conclusions. The lawyer thus provides invaluable aid to the judges in discharging their functions. On account of it the judges should be considerate and courteous towards the members of the bar. They should respect the privileges of the Bar. Similarly, the lawyers are officers of the court and they are required to maintain towards the court respectful attitude. The court acts on the statement of the lawyers and, therefore, they are expected to be absolutely fair to the court. A Dr. is under moral and legal obligations not to divulge any such secret, told to him by a patient expect under certain circumstances. Privilege communication made by a patient to a Dr. who has a corresponding legal, social moral duty to protect the public. Health Departments notifications of a number of communicable disease is required by law. There is no clear legal or moral answer regarding a physicians reporting confidential medical diagnosis to a partner. Dr. Maurice feels comfortable in disclosing information to a governmental agency rather than to a third party. Law touches all aspects of human life even regarding privacy, secrecy.

The forests are the foundation of the economy of the hill villages. The forests provide fodder for their animals. Dry twigs supply them with domestic cooking fuel. Forests are also a great source of fruits, edible nuts, fibres and herbs etc. The forests break the flow of seasonal rainfall. As a result, springs and perennial streams are created. They are very useful for the hilly people and their animals during the summer season. These rich forests have been destroyed for a long time. The forests of Tehri-Garhwal were cut to supply timber for railways in the plains. Mixed oak forests were destroyed to grow new food crops like potatoes for the Europeans in Mussoorie. In 1930, the people of Tehri-Garhwal started a Satyagraha to protect the forests. The people of this region called a protest meeting against official forest policy. A large number of people were killed in Tehri by the armed forces of the kingdom of Tehri-Garhwal. After India became free, another movement to save forests was started. It was known as 'Chipko Movement'. The village people put their bodies around trees to stop them from being cut. As a result, the state government was compelled to think about the forests.

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
