Harmony between two individuals (adults and children here) exists only when there's an awareness of each other's rights and children don't even know that they have rights to recognise when they are violated. For example, in 2007, the Ministry of women and child development had released the findings of the largest empirical study which said that more than 60 per cent of Indian children are subjected to abuse of some kind including sexual abuse. It is important that the society recognises the importance of teaching child rights to our children. India is a signatory to an international treaty called the "United Nations convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)". This has enabled the parliament of India to pass an Important legislation called the "Juvenile & Justice Act" (JJ Act) and to create a commission called the National commission for protection of child Rights (NCPCR). Concerted and pragmatic efforts are needed to create widespread empowerment of ordinary citizens (including children themselves) to create awareness about child rights. Instead of observing November 14 as 'Children's Day' it should be called child rights day.
