Burgess and Locke observe "Family is a social group of persons united by the ties of marriage, blood or adoption; consisting a single house hold, interacting and intercommunicating with each other in their respective social roles of husband and wife, mother and father, son and daughter, brother and sister creating a common culture". Mating relationship through the institution of marriage, procreation and legalizing the children, having distinct identifiable name for the family; common habitation, economic base, closely knitted relations are some of the important features of the family.
